SEASHORE ARCHAEOLOGY

On one of the stalls at the Furlongs Festival was **Chris Kolonka** with fascinating information about the ways we can help explore the treasures (buried treasures!) of our coast-line. He will be giving a talk about this at the next Residents Association meeting (7pm on 10th October at the Bacchus) but here as an appetizer is a piece from him:

The coast of England is under constant threat from wind, waves, & winter storms. These threats wreak havoc on England's varied coastal & intertidal heritage, not only exposing these sites but washing them away before they are ever seen. The English coast is one of the largest archaeological sites in the country, with all periods from the Mesolithic through to the Cold War represented in some form. Some of these remains are extremely vulnerable to coastal erosion, shifting sands & rising tides, & as a result need to be identified & recorded before they are lost.

CITiZAN ~ the Coastal & Intertidal Zone Archaeological Network www.citizan.org.uk

was set up in response to these dynamic threats to our island heritage. Funded by the Heritage Lottery Fund, we are a community archaeology project working in the areas of England exposed at low tide but covered at high tide. We are actively promoting site recording & long-term monitoring programmes led by volunteers. Everyone can get involved with the project. The intertidal zone around Sutton-on-Sea features many fascinating & relatively unknown archaeological sites. As this stretch of coast is always changing, with some sites being only temporarily exposed, there is a lot out there to be rediscovered.

With seas so quickly becoming treacherous many ships have ended up being wrecked. Sometimes also ships were At least six wrecks survive along our part of the coast. The remains of an unidentified post-Medieval fishing vessel & what are believed to be the remains of the Stavanger, a Norwegian sailing ship, both survive here. More recent history can also be found to the north of Mablethorpe. A Cold War Royal Observer Corps monitoring post survives in the dunes near Quebec Road. Such posts were established along England's coast to monitor the direction & strength of a nuclear blast.




Nick Mason CITiZAN Archaeologist based in York & working with communities & local societies on outreach events along England's north east coast.

Thankfully the monitoring posts were never required to record an actual nuclear explosion. The Mablethorpe site was operational from June 1961 & finally closed in September 1991. Sites such as this one, that are very much still within living memory, are just as important as older coastal archaeological sites.

Many old photos show remains of wrecks & the ancient forest half buried on our beach; but these are just a small indication of what is out there & what, with modern technology we are now able to log.

So if you are interested do come along to the meeting in October & see how you can help!

SUNKEN SUTTON



At the low tide of Monday 13th August (scheduled for 2-32pm) many of us went out patrolling the beach to see if the forecast was accurate & the ancient forest would be exposed. Unfortunately, whether due to the beach re-nourishment scheme or the sprites of the ancient woodland, nothing was seen except a solitary tree stump just off Trusthorpe.

But it did give us an excuse to unearth the map opposite & to look up details of what happened to our sunken Sutton with only the font in the present St Clement's church having been salvaged from that time.

In 1287 there was a heat-wave with tree-rings suggesting that no rain fell between April & July. Storms followed the heat bringing havoc along the south coast. Then in December came a surge which drowned 50,000 the other side of the North Sea & created what's now called the Zuider Zee. On the Lincolnshire coast, the islands which protected the saltmarsh were swept away; & this meant that, on the following New Year's Day, waves rose round Mablethorpe's old church of St Peter. The monks of Hagnaby told of how its chalice was found "crushed under a heap of stones". On February 4th the sea flooded in as far as Maltby drowning men, sheep & cattle; & on August 14th the sea came in againleaving the coast-line more like the one we know today.

and while on the subject of churches & water...

Just behind where the font salvaged from the ancient church now stands ~ in the "Church with the leaning tower" is the TOILET. And if nature summons & you pay a visit you will see there a recently installed framed photograph of a toilet in Malawi.

The reason?

Every year St Clement's gives a certain amount of its income to good causes... some local & some far away.

Because (amazingly!) 2.4 billiom people ~ roughly a third of the world's population ~ are still without the modern (actually Elizabethan) convenience of a toilet the charity **TOILET TWINNING** was founded with the idea that homes, halls & churches could "twin" their toilet with one for a community in need.




Homes can twin their toilet with another for as little as £60 whereas larger sums can be invested in whole toilet blocks. The sanitation of a community comes about through building & plumbing but also by the accompanying education. The slogan means what it says: the charity is "Saving Lives One Toilet at a Time!"... Women & children are so vulnerable when seeking for a loo at night or even in broad daylight. This is a project which is thus a vital part of the process of extending human dignity.




